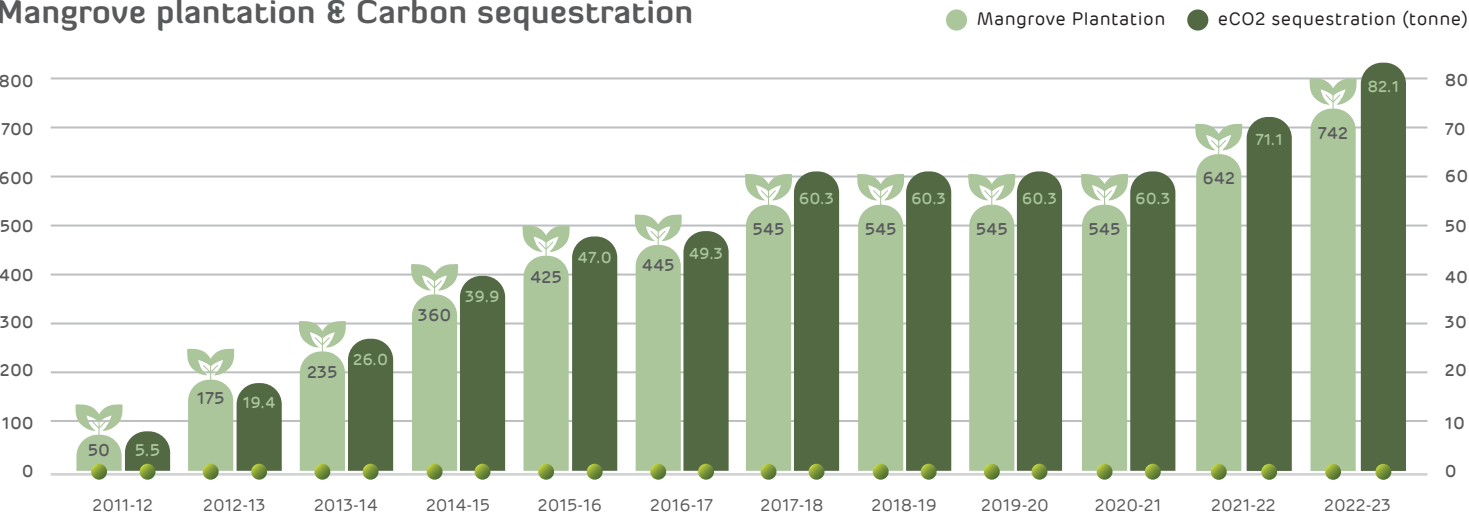
Ground water TDS levels (mg/L), Central groundwater board observation stations, Luni & Karaghogha



## Mangrove Plantation

Since FY 2011-12, the Adani Foundation has spearheaded mangrove plantation along the shoreline of Mundra (Kutch). Until 2022-23, total 7,42,000 plants have been transplanted, bringing 449.7 acres under green cover. With a survival rate of 90%, it estimated that these mangrove forests have helped carbon sequestration of 58,162 tonnes of carbon dioxide.

## Reaping the Demographic Dividend: Creating Pathways for Socio-Economic Empowerment through Sustainable Livelihoods



According to the latest United Nations Population Fund data, India's population in 2023 stands at 142.86 crore. We are the world's most populous country. We have the world's youngest population and the largest rural population.

To unlock the potential of this demographic dividend for the growth and success of our nation, the key is enabling sustainable livelihoods in rural India. They lead to holistic socio-economic development of families and communities. They create a stable and steady flow of income, which is used towards education, healthcare, improved standard of living and ultimately translates to consumption / purchasing power. Moreover, adequate socio-economic opportunities have shown to mitigate migration.

To this end, the Adani Foundation's interventions aim to:

- Increase, diversify and sustain incomes.
- Enable greater participation of women in the workforce.
- Create comprehensive eco-systems which provide education, training, access to capital and market linkage support.

Read on for a glimpse of the major interventions:



# Improving Incomes from Agriculture & Animal Husbandry

As per the Economic Survey 2022-23, 65% of India's population lives in the rural areas, out of which 47% are dependent on agriculture for livelihood. Amid rising input costs, lack of irrigation facilities and low productivity, the survey states that the focus needs to be on diversification to millets, pulses, oilseeds, horticulture, animal husbandry, dairying, and fisheries.

The Adani Foundation's efforts encompass reducing input cost, training for implementing best practices, increasing productivity and facilitating infrastructure support.

Take for instance the case of 42-year-old Sajna bai Meena, a resident of Amapura village in Baran, Rajasthan. She has 10 bigha (2.75 acres approx.) of land but had no idea about how to move forward after her husband's sudden demise in 2018. That was when the Foundation intervened and motivated her to develop an orchard. With the initial support of 70 fruit saplings, improved variety of vegetable seeds and handholding, her farm flourished. Today, she also rears five cattle animals successfully with the support of the Adani Foundation.

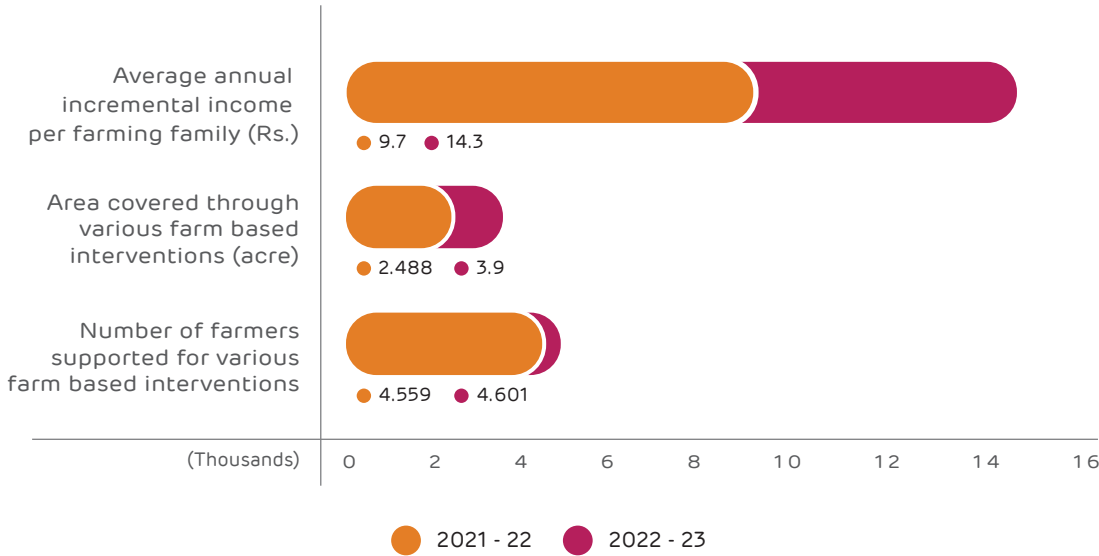


The milk is useful for consumption at home and the excess is sold to a Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) called Hadoti Prageetsheel Producer Co. Ltd., which is supported by the Adani Foundation. Today she is earning an average of INR 15,000 per month and providing for her six children – four girls and two boys.

The Foundation is empowering more than 25,000 marginal and small farmers with more than 20,000 acres of land under cultivation.

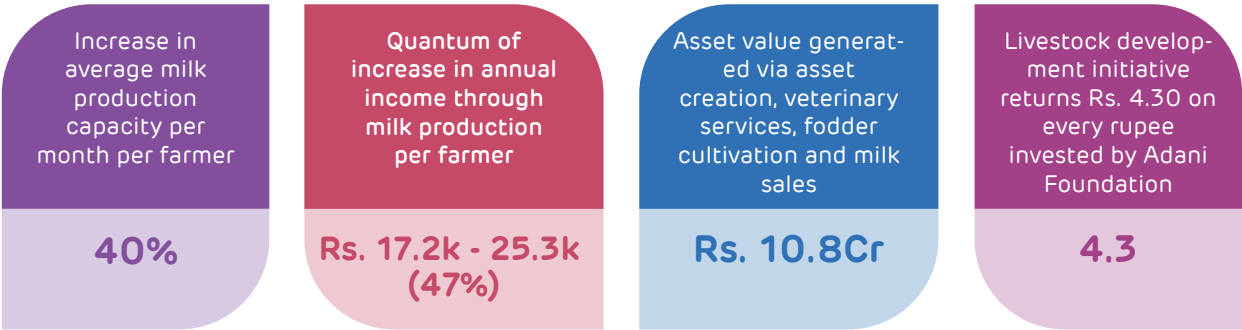
## Farm-based livelihoods

There has been a steady increase in the coverage of farm-based interventions across sites resulting into 47% hike in the average incremental income per farming family.

## 2 Promoting Sustainable Livelihoods through Self-Help Groups

According to World Bank data, the female workforce participation has fallen from 32% in 2005 to 19% in 2021. Their participation in the workforce is paramount for the Indian economy to prosper. In other words, focusing on sustainable livelihoods and jobs without focusing on women is not a fruitful strategy. At the Adani Foundation, we enable women in farming related activities, but an equally important strategy is ensuring that women become earning members in the family. For this, we encourage their home-based enterprises and provide the necessary support in terms of access to capital, linkages with government schemes and providing training as per market demands.

For example, the women of Jamilabath village in Thiruvallur district of Tamil Nadu were weaving entrepreneurial dreams through their eco-friendly products. In 2021, they were trained in designing and

making palm leaf products and registered under the name Arrahaman Oringinantha Panai Olai Porutkak Sangam. The total of 30 members are organized into two self-help groups (SHGs) for ease of conducting business and monitoring. In FY 2022-23, their total annual turnover was INR 3.7 lakh. They recently underwent a 2-month program for upskilling to learn newer designs and techniques.

In FY 2022-23, more than 300 such women's SHGs have generated an income upwards of INR 30 Cr.

## 3 Skilling & Upskilling for Employment & Entrepreneurship

According to the International Labour Organisation (ILO), the Indian labour force is set to grow by over 8 million per annum over the coming decade. Educating and skilling the youth is indispensable to achieve national goals. Through Adani Saksham, the Adani Foundation is on a mission to skill Indian youth. Aligned with the Government's Skill India Mission, it has provided skill-based training in 75 domain and non-domain courses to 1,23,164 people (as of end of FY 2022-23) across 13 states in India, out of which 60,281, trainees are female.

Take for example the journey of 40-year-old Lilandari Nishad who contracted polio as a child, and this became a hurdle for her at every stage in life. In a family of 17 members and only one breadwinner, she longed to be able to help. Her will power and passion culminated as she underwent a tailoring course at Adani Skill

Development Centre (ASDC). She not only began operating her own stitching unit from home, but also trained 10 girls in her village Chandli (Chhattisgarh), paying forward what she received! Today, she is earning up to INR 5,000 per month and is self-reliant in the truest sense.

In summary, the size and age of a country's workforce plays a huge role in its economic growth, which in India's case is on our side.

**The onus is now upon all of us to complement this demographic strength with new-age skills and a strong entrepreneurial spirit for the people to make progress and be limitless!**

# Adani Vidya Mandir

A total of four Adani Vidya Mandir (AVM) schools are providing free education to more than 3,000 meritorious students, annually, from economically weaker sections of society. The schools offer the best-in-class infrastructure and facilities to students along with healthy meals, uniforms, books, stationery and transportation. The AVM schools are currently operational in Ahmedabad, Gujarat (AVMA), Bhadreshwar, Gujarat (AVMB), Surguja, Chhattisgarh (AVMS), and Krishnapatnam, Andhra Pradesh (AVMK).



## FY 2022-23 Highlights



Flying Cadet Sergeant (SGT) **Khevna Parmar** of AVMA, of No. 2 Gujarat Air Squadron NCC, Ahmedabad, is **the only Girl Cadet from Air Wing**, Junior Division, to represent the state of Gujarat in the year 2022's Ceremonious Republic Day Parade.



With utmost discipline and determination, **Brijesh Dafda** of AVMA secured **first rank** in the SC category, Gujarat, in the **NEET 2022** (National Eligibility Entrance Test) scoring 660 out of 720 marks (99.98 percentile).



18 students of AVMA, from class 9 and 11, received the Prime Minister's Young Achievers Scholarship Award Scheme for Vibrant India (YASASVI) Scholarship 2022. Under this program, class 9 students will receive INR 75,000 and class 11 students will receive INR 1,25,000 annually.

Sameer Yadav, a Std. X student of AVMS, participated in the Chhattisgarh State Open Javelin Throw Championship '22 organised by Athletic Federation of India at Bilaspur on 7th August 2022 and bagged the Bronze Medal.



AVMK got the permission from the Andhra Pradesh Government to start junior college from academic year 2023-24. This will offer continuity of quality education to the students after Class 10.

## Highlights of FY 2022-23



Adani World School, Krishnapatnam, received affiliation with the Sainik School Society under the Ministry of Defense, as part of which the first batch of Class 6 commenced its classes from academic year 2022-23.



Class 4 students Ishwari Desmukh and Pranjal Sharman of NRC School, Mohone, Kalyan were conferred with a Special Achievement Prize for being the Best Speakers and Best Presenters at the district level Science and Math project exhibition cum competition.

Devandh Gadhavi, a student of Adani Public School, Mundra, won the Best Athlete Trophy with seven medals in the CBSE Cluster Level Athletics Meet held at Gandhinagar, Gujarat in January 2023.



Namrata Mayee of Adani DAV School, Dhamra created an IoT based project for protecting forests from forest fires and indiscriminate cutting of trees. She was granted an advance of INR 10,000 to prepare the project for the district level and INR 25,000 after she was selected for the state level to modify and benchmark her project.





# Partnerships

## AVMS & AVMK Collaborate with BYJU'S

Most of the students of Adani Vidya Mandir, Surguja (AVMS) – a tribal district – are first generation learners who lack basic facilities and academic support post school hours. By collaborating with the renowned educational technology company BYJU'S, the school has provided all the students from classes 4 to 10 with their personalized tablets having customized content as per their age/standard. Each child can access self-paced learning even after school hours with digitalized and customized tablet without the usage of internet. Additionally, seven rooms in the school are converted into digital learning spaces for enhancing the teaching learning experience. Similarly, four rooms in Adani Vidya Mandir, Krishnapatnam (AVMK), are converted into smart classrooms through the partnership.



## Adani Foundation Partners with NIE International, Singapore



The Adani Foundation has partnered with the National Institute of Education (NIE) International, a part of Nanyang Technological University (NTU), Singapore, to curate and conduct an extensive STEM Leadership Program. Under this collaboration, facilitated by the Temasek Foundation (Singapore), 42 teachers from six Adani Foundation schools will be trained by experts from NIE. The program will be conducted over a period of 3 years (April 2023 to December 2025) and is divided into six phases. The first phase – scheduled from April 14 to 16 – is already complete. During the fifth phase, the participants will visit Singapore to observe STEM lessons in school and interact with STEM teachers. The key outcome will be the establishment of a robust network of STEM educators in Singapore and India and a STEM Curricular Framework in the Indian context.

## AVMA Joins Hands with UNICEF



In a one-of-its-kind collaboration, Adani Vidya Mandir, Ahmedabad (AVMA), partnered with UNICEF to roll out the 'UNICEF on Campus Knowledge Initiative' for all the school students from June to December 2023. The initiative will create platforms and opportunities for the students to increase their awareness about child rights as articulated in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and priority areas such as climate action, life skills, body positivity and self-esteem, nutrition, anaemia, online safety, financial literacy, ending violence against children, among others. Children will be engaged through innovative and strategic digital and on-ground campaigns, capacity building sessions as well as lecture series/talks with young leaders and influencers.



# Utthan

Utthan aims to **improve foundational literacy and numeracy** among progressive learners and facilitate holistic development of government schools. An **Utthan Sahayak** (supplementary teacher) is appointed in each school who acts as a catalyst and facilitator.

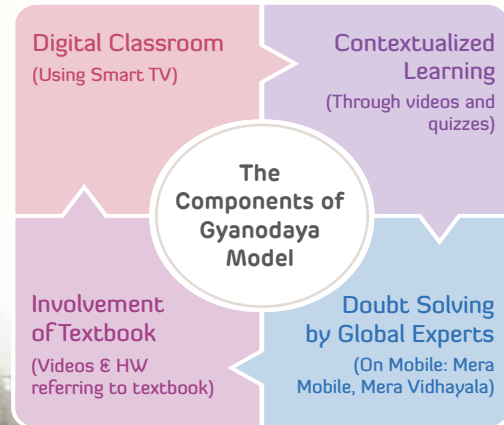

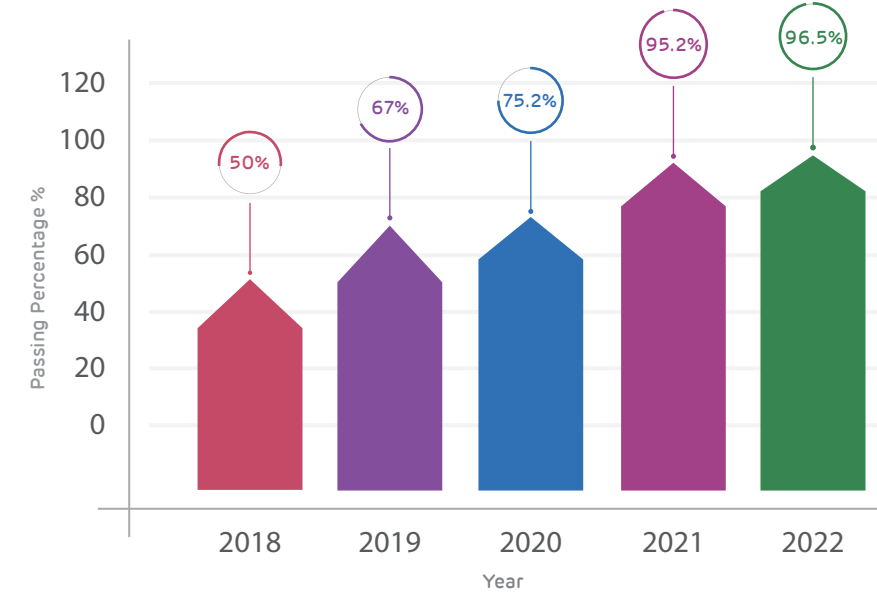

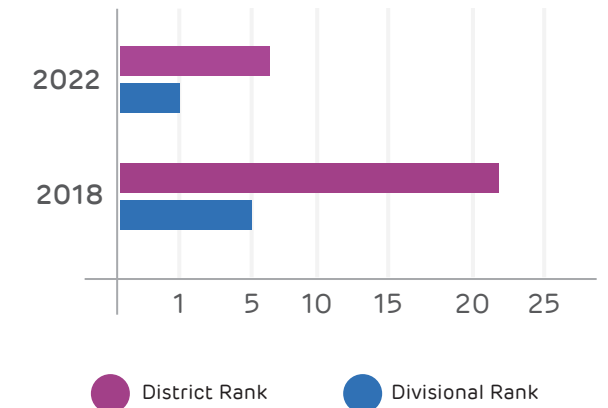

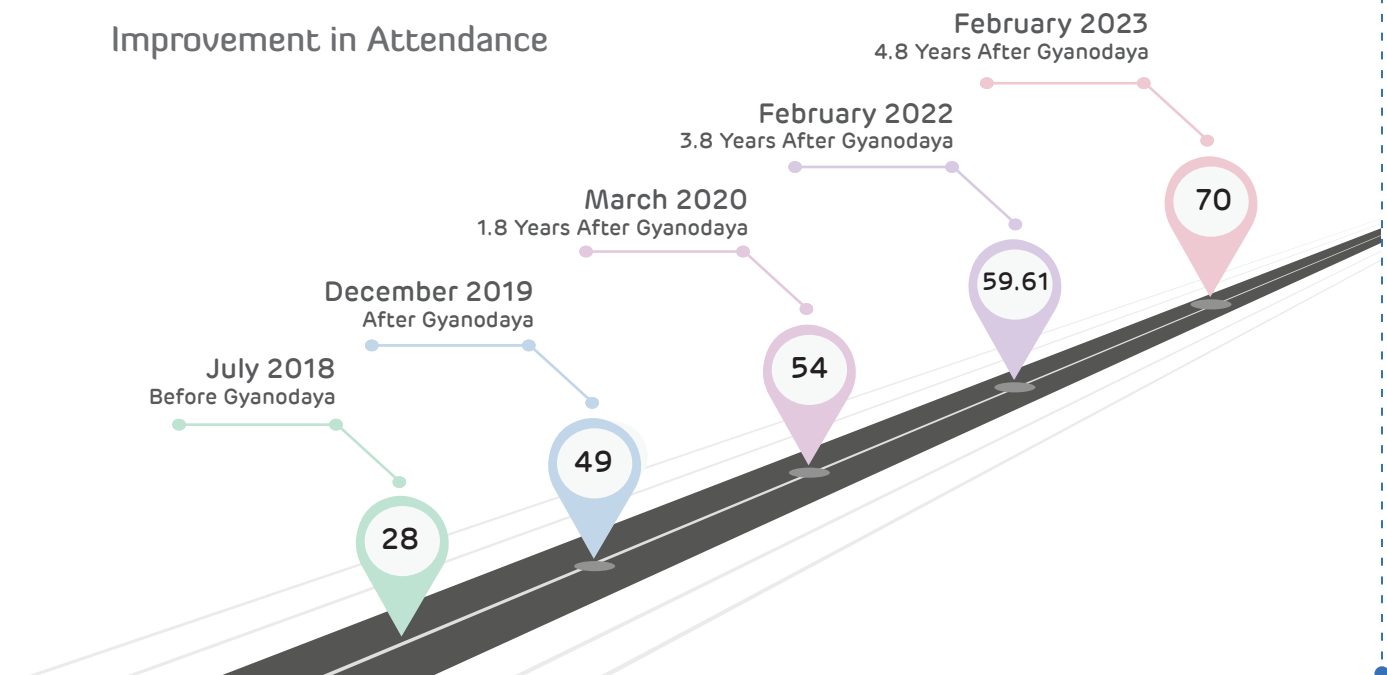
Class 10 passing percentage

## Transforming Healthcare in Rural India



The Adani Foundation is investing in community health through deployment of resources and services on the ground. The aim is to reach out to the most needy and vulnerable population at the grassroots. The impetus is on pan India projects - Mobile Health Care Units for doorstep delivery of healthcare, running wellness centres and rural clinics, organising health camps, and building and running multi-speciality hospitals.

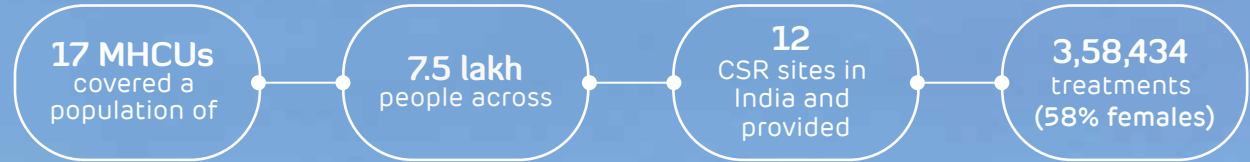




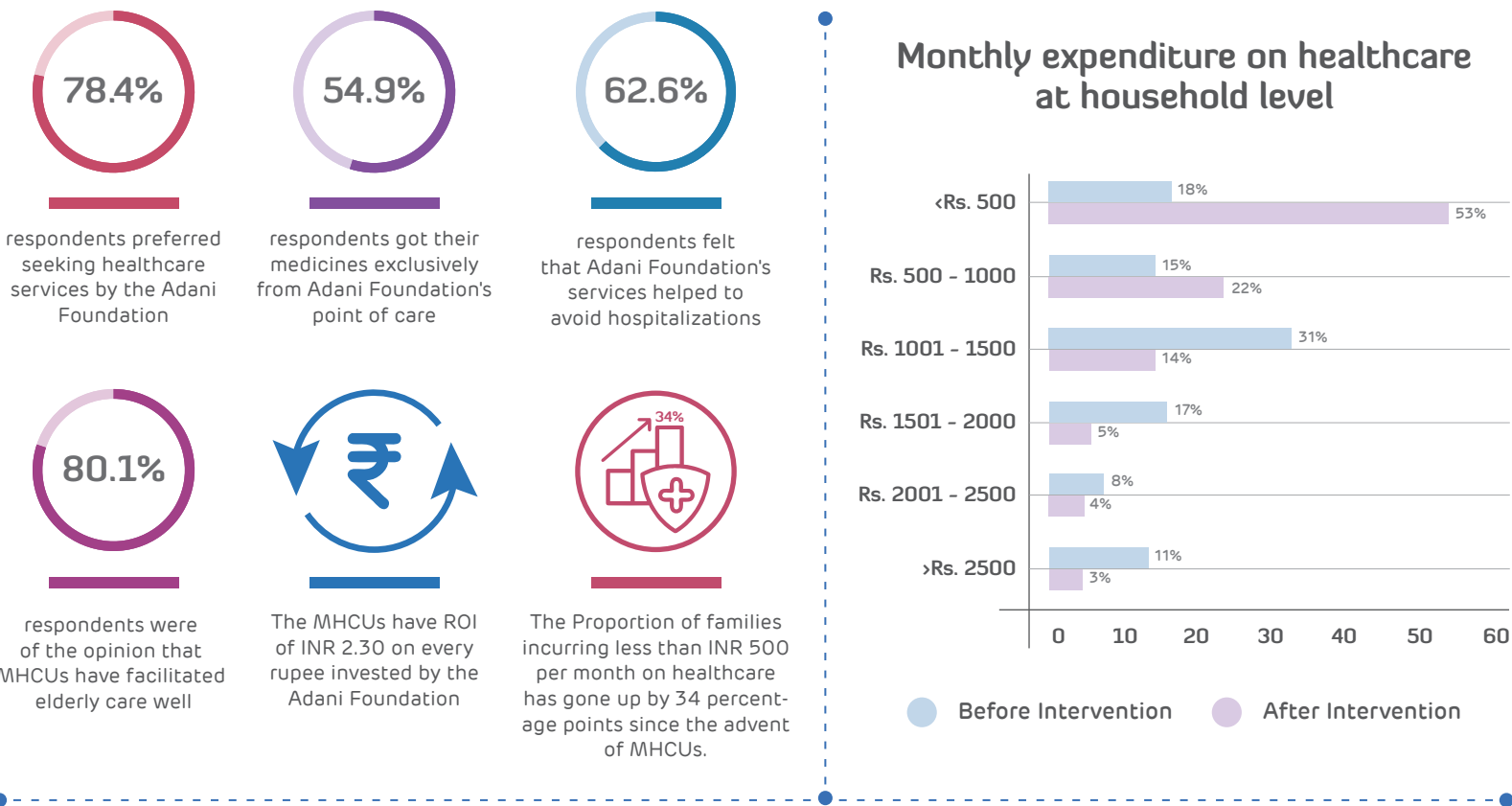
# Mobile Health Care Units (MHCU)

MHCUs ensure that quality healthcare services reach the doorsteps of needy people in remote villages. These are armed with qualified medical professionals, generic medicines and basic diagnostic tools. Those patients who require further testing and care are referred to the nearest medical facility.

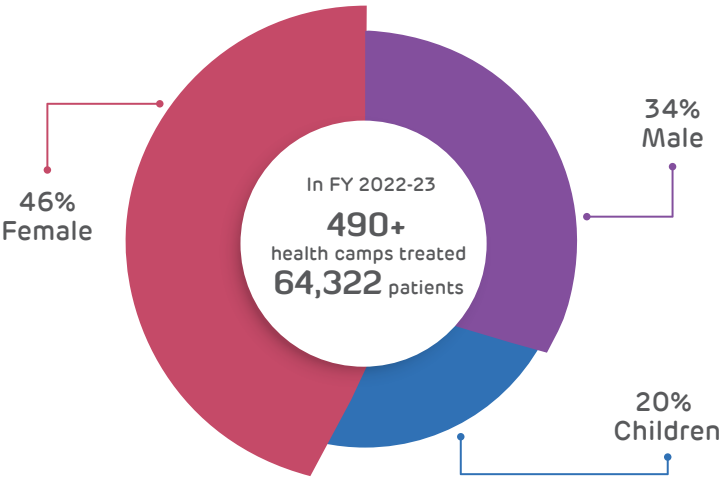

Coming from a poor family, the burden of expensive medical bills for her treatment made things difficult for her. She was very happy and grateful when the MHCU services started in her village and she could get free quality medical care. She is not only receiving required treatment periodically but is also saving money on her monthly medicines (approximately INR 2,500 to 3,000).”



# Multispecialty Health Camps

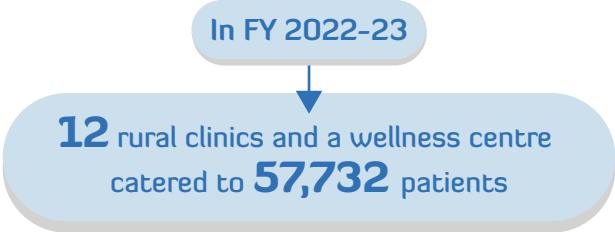

# Rural Clinics

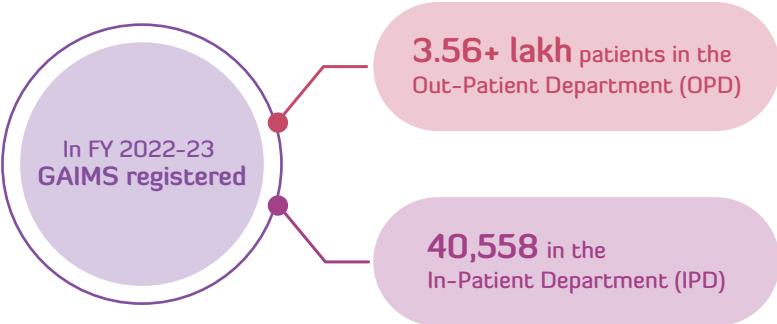

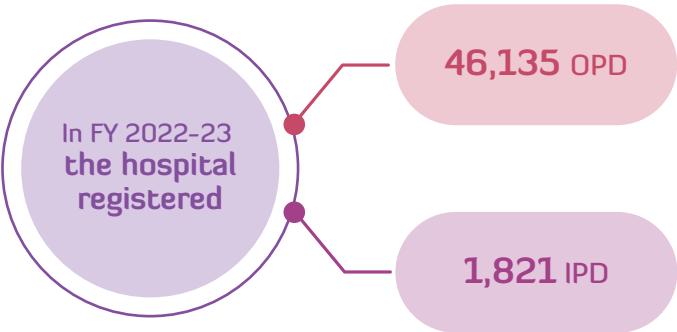
# GAIMS, Bhuj

It is the only medical college and multi-specialty modern teaching district hospital (G.K. General Hospital) in Kutch district.

The Adani Hospital in Mundra is a 100-bed secondary care hospital catering to healthcare needs of the local population of Mundra and neighboring areas. It is committed to grooming medical professionals and providing clinical services at affordable rates.





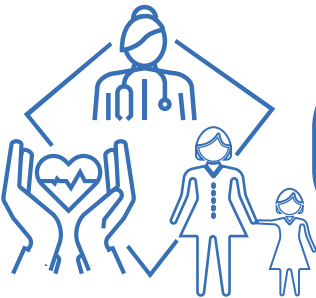
# Key Highlights



The Village Sanitation Program in Krishnapatnam (Andhra Pradesh) provided sanitation support in 8 villages, benefiting 18,000+ families, with the help of 136 community volunteers.



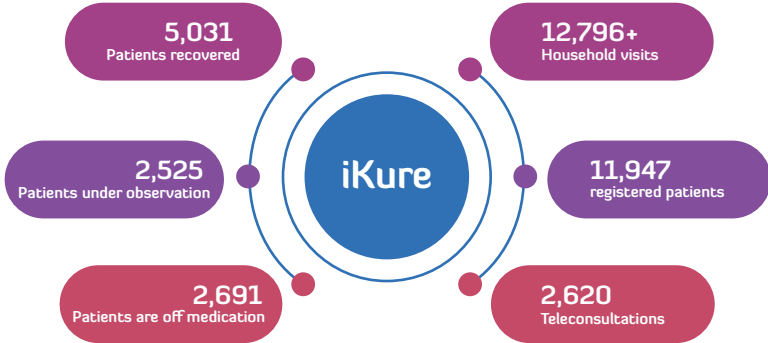
The Anemia Control Program in Dighi (Maharashtra) is targeted towards children and women from fishing community in Raigad district, in line with the government schemes. It includes creating awareness, counselling, capacity building of women as well as adolescent girls, and nutritional care for children between 0 and 6 years of age.



848 women and girls from 16 villages participated in this program.



In partnership with iKure in Dhamra (Odisha), 20 Community Health Workers (CHWs) are upskilled to become Community Health Entrepreneurs (CHEs). Using the iKure Digital Health Platform, the CHEs offer tele-consultation services with doctors to the community members. They also capture health related data for developing a population health management system.



As part of the Total Health Programme, in partnership with the Apollo Foundation, one mega camp and four general health screening camps were organized in 8 villages in Krishnapatnam (Andhra Pradesh). Out of the 2,447 women screened, 64 were suspected with carcinoma and were suitably referred for follow up.

# Agriculture & Allied Activities

The Adani Foundation is working with small and marginal farmers to upgrade their farming skills by promoting improved cropping practices and crop diversification. The aim is to reduce input cost, increase productivity, enhance quality of the produce, and ultimately boost incomes.



## Highlights of FY 2022-23



In Dhamra, Odisha, training was imparted to 419 small and marginal farmers on paddy, commercial vegetable cultivation and high value cash crop farming. Notably, the convergence program with the District Agriculture Department for implementation of Paddy Line Transplanting has increased the yield by 45 to 50% with an average monetary benefit of INR 22,000 to 24,000. The yield has been enhanced from 12 to 15 quintal/acre in traditional practice to 31 to 33 quintal/acre by adopting System of Rice Intensification (SRI) technology for 62 farmers.

The Adani Foundation has taken steps to educate the farmers of Minjur Block, Thiruvallur district, on natural farming through training, live demos, input material support and monitoring. In FY 2022-23, 300 farmers were facilitated to cultivate paddy on one acre, bringing 300 acres under cultivation. These farmers are working collectively and will avail government subsidy for group-based cultivation and support each other. Further, the market linkage between farmers and Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) was done by promotion cum sale of the organic rice through Marutham – an FPO of women.



Wadi Project, Dahanu – As part of the Integrated Tribal Development Program in Dahanu, Maharashtra, the Adani Foundation is supporting 1,000 families for cultivation of vegetables, horticulture and floriculture. This year, 200 farmers have collectively marketed jasmine, with each farmer earning INR 10,000 per month.

In Vizhinjam, the Kitchen Garden initiative is progressing well, with 500 new kitchen gardens implemented this year, taking the total numbers since the start of the programme from FY 2020-21 to 1,280. Almost every household in harvesting 35-40 kg vegetables per month.





Highlights of FY 2022-23


- ➔ Kutch Kalpaturu Producer Company (KKPC) – a Farmers’ Producer Organization (FPO) – was established in 2020 with 237 farmers. What started with supporting date palm cultivators, now includes initiatives such as milk supply to colonies, NB 21 off shoot Supply, Cattle feed supply, etc. Its yearly turnover was INR 28.89 lakh.
- ➔ A total of 2,242 units of vermicomposting are supported till date, producing an average of 5,830 MT per year, generating a total revenue of INR 466.37 lakh (price INR 8 per kg) per year.
- ➔ The Adani Foundation in association with the Municipal Corporation in Shahanshahpur area of Varanasi has set up a state-of-the-art Varanasi Bio-Conversion Project (VBCP). The project is supported by Animal Husbandry department of Uttar Pradesh, Bharat Gas Energy Limited, and Varanasi Smart City Development. As in January '23, the production of the plant as follows:
  - CBG Production: 7,892 kg (Avg: 605 kg per day)
  - LFOM (Liquid Slurry): 1,068 KL (Cum. 3,297 KL)
  - FOM: 9 MT (Cum. 268 MT)
- ➔ Biogas – 225 home biogas units were installed in seven villages of Mundra to reduce the use of chemical fertilizer while reducing smoke related irritation during cooking.




Livestock Dairy Development

The Adani Foundation is improving the well-being of cattle and cattle rearing families at 15 CSR sites across 9 states in India.


- Building capacity of farmers and creating awareness about recommended animal husbandry practices
- Delivering high-quality breeding services by promoting artificial insemination (AI) and other vital healthcare services
- Scientific management of livestock, taking into consideration various aspects such as fodder, azolla and silage development for adapting healthy feeding practices
- Scheduling vaccination and health camps for disease control

- ➔ In Dhamra, Odisha, doorstep delivery service through Mobile Veterinary Unit (MVU) is provided. This service of artificial insemination through sex-sorted semen has ensured birth of 90% female calves and registered higher milk volume.
- ➔ Mundra, Gujarat has engaged **192 farmers** who have adopted and cultivated NAPIER Grass (nutrient rich variety) in 190-acre area. This best quality fodder cultivation is yielding **3,800 tonnes** of fodder annually, saving INR 52 lakh which otherwise would have been spent on buying it.
- ➔ In Tirora and Kawai, a strong partnership between milk producers, district co-operative milk unions and the Adani Foundation is enhancing dairy development. The milk collection has reached 7,400 litres per day, with a monthly turnover of **INR XX**.





# Enabling Women's Entrepreneurial Ventures

## Milestones

In Dahej, the Adani Foundation is supporting 9 Self-Help Groups (SHGs) – 5 in Dahej area and 4 in the tribal area – all of which are registered under Mission Manglam of Livelihood Mission. **104 members** of these SHGs generated a total turnover of **INR XX**.



In Mundra, 10 SHGs have been established which engage **127 women** who generated a turnover of **INR 88 lakh** during FY 2022-23.



In Mumbai, Swabhimaan project was initiated at Mira Road and Malad-Malwani areas to empower women, with Mahila Aarthik Vikas Mahamandal (MAVIM) as the implementation partner. In FY 2022-23, **300 women** were trained in 10 trades who collectively invested **INR 65,000** and earned **INR 1.2 lakh**



As a part of **Vizmart** – a marketplace for the women-led livelihood group in Vizhinjam, Kerala – a workers' canteen was inaugurated at the port. The group also started a mini supermarket and purchased a three-wheeler for transportation of goods. Vizmart is run by a group of **62 women** who run **18 types of businesses** and generated an annual turnover of **INR XX** this year.

## Building & Strengthening Rural Infrastructure



Infrastructure facilities bear a direct impact on the standard of living and the micro economy of the community. The Adani Foundation is dedicated to bridge the gaps by augmenting existing facilities and creating new infrastrture. Its efforts are directed towards the development of schools, primary healthcare centres, water conservation structures and other village development works.

# Water Related Projects

## Water Conservation

- Deepened total 31 village ponds across 10 sites in Mundra, Tirora, Godda, Hazira, Dhamra, Kattupali, Kawai, Raigarh, Jaislamer and Raipur
- Recharged 19 wells and constructed 2 percolation wells in Mundra
- Installed 42 Roof Top Rainwater Harvesting structures in Mundra and Dhamra
- Constructed 140-meter retaining wall on the bund in Lakhigam, Dahej to strengthen it

## Drinking Water Facilities

- Installed 44 Borewells with Handpumps in 4 sites - Tirora, Godda, Dhamra and Raigarh (Tamnar)
- Installed 7 community RO plants of capacity 1,000 LPH in 4 sites - Mundra, Dahanu, Kattupali and Krishnapatnam
- Installation of solar submersible pump with pipeline laying in Khairbodi village of Tirora.

# Education-related Infrastructure

Developed a greenbelt around Luvara pond in with the plantation of over 3,750 saplings and 166-meter-long fencing. 250 plants with tree guards on both side of the approach road have also been facilitated. Provided 913-meter-long fencing at Mora village on road divider with plantation of more than 1,500 plants



Godda, Jharkhand

Constructed 9 community bathrooms with soak-pit in 7 villages of Godda and Sahebganj district to address the needs of 300 women and girls



# SuPoshan

## Empowering Women, Nurturing Communities



Project SuPoshan is a community-based intervention to combat malnutrition in children under five years of age and improve the nutritional status of adolescent girls and women in the reproductive age group. Village level volunteers are identified and trained to become SuPoshan Sanginis, who play a pivotal role in spreading awareness, promoting referrals and catalyzing behavioural change.

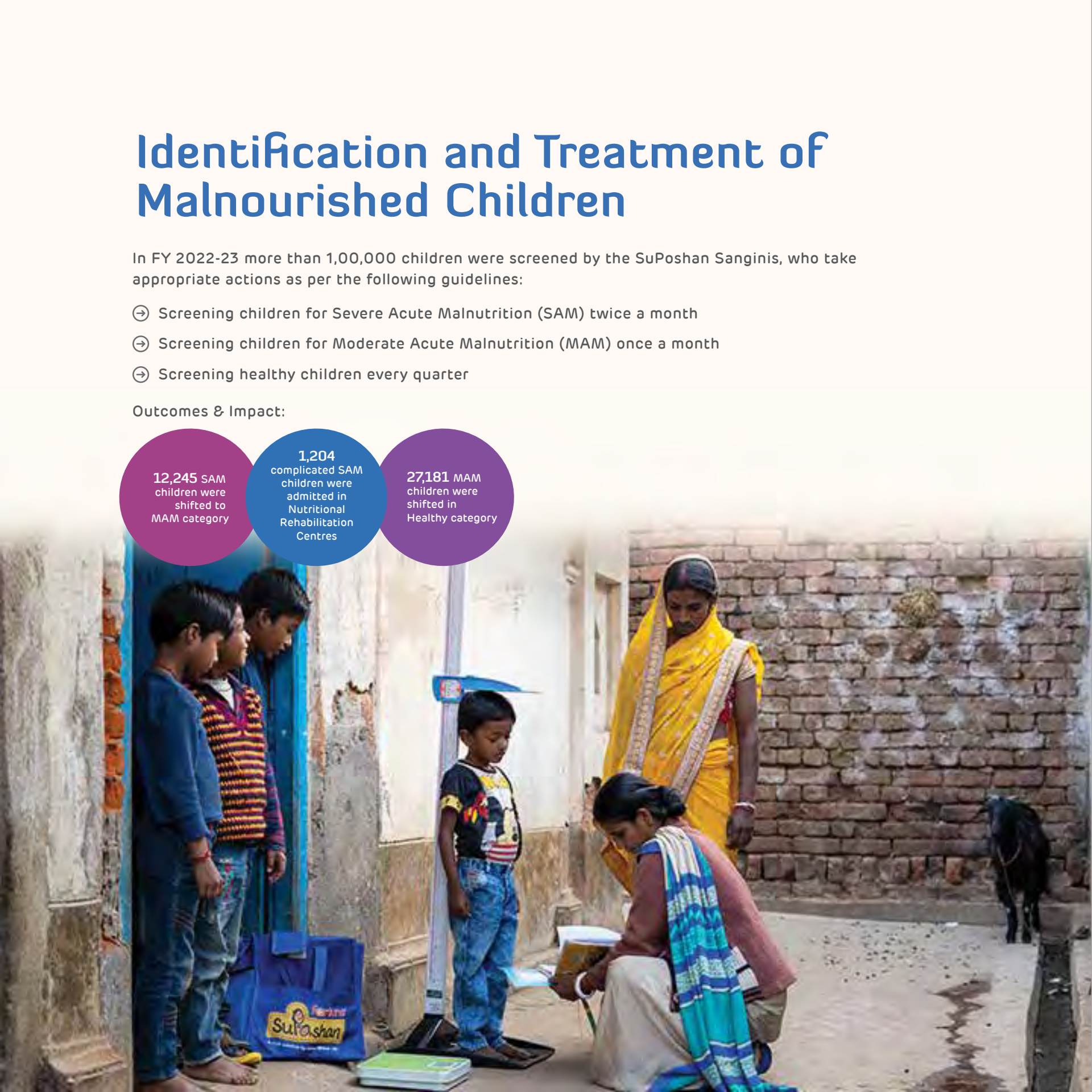


# Identification and Treatment of Malnourished Children

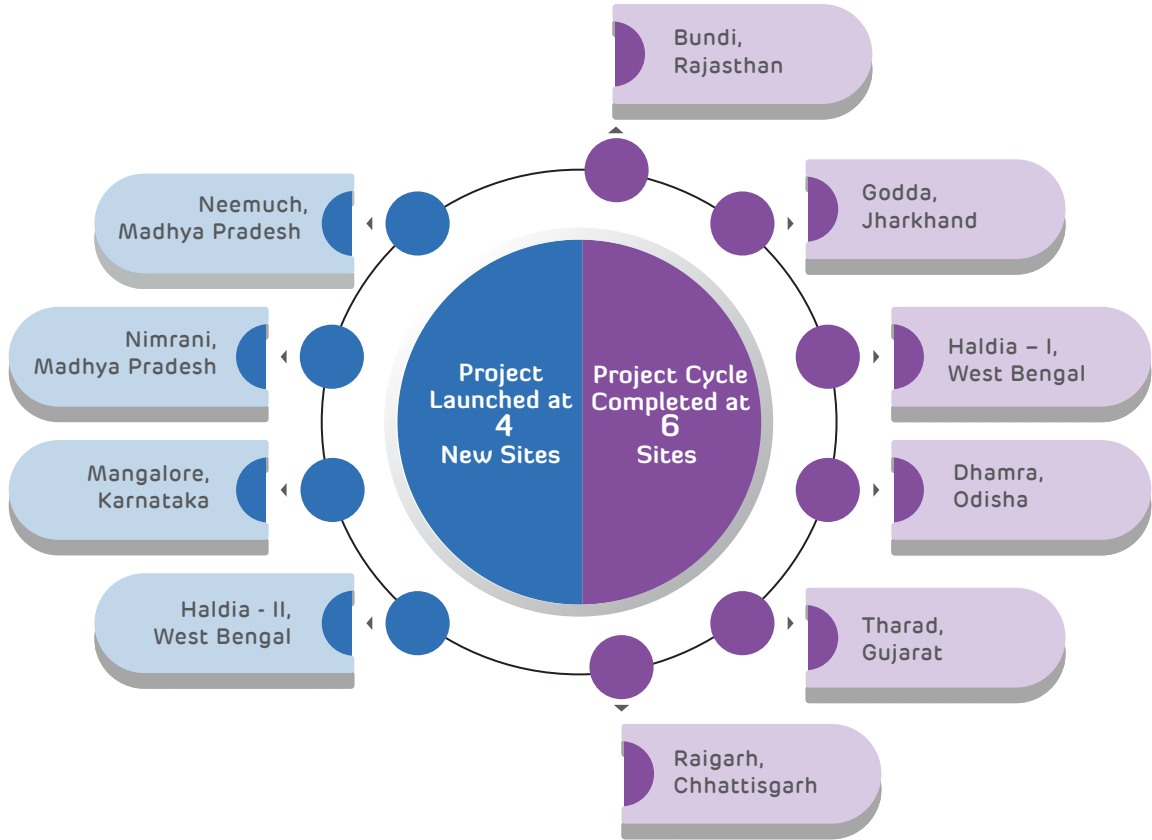
In FY 2022-23 more than 1,00,000 children were screened by the SuPoshan Sanginis, who take appropriate actions as per the following guidelines:

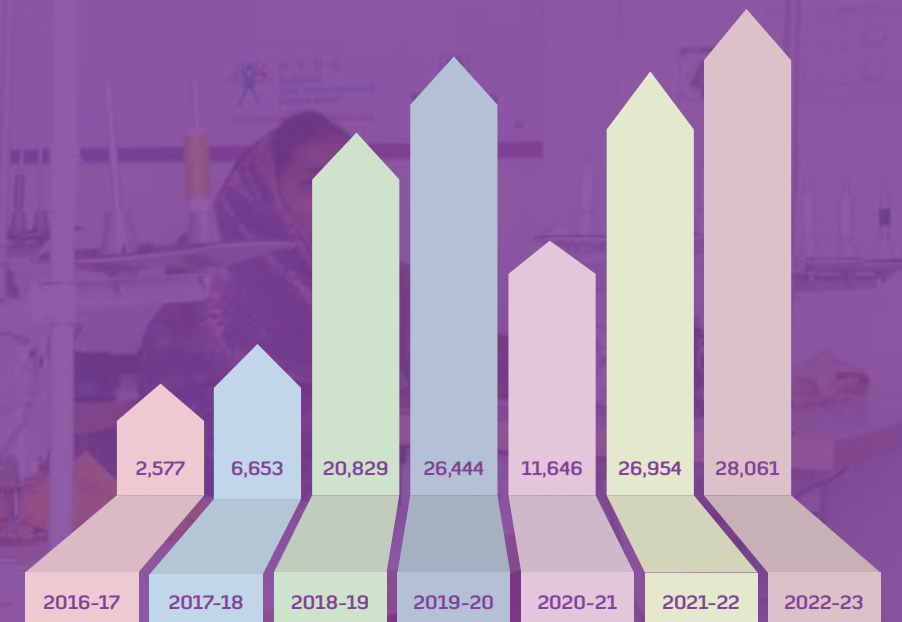
“Kushmin Nishad, from Gaurkheda village in Raipur, Chhattisgarh, was facing several challenges during her fourth pregnancy, including low weight and a haemoglobin level below 8g/dL. Of her three previous pregnancies, only one child had survived. This time, Kushmin received timely support from Neera Sahu, a SuPoshan Sangini, who guided her on the importance of proper nutrition and weight gain during pregnancy. Their efforts paid off as she gained of 7.5 kg in the last four months of pregnancy, significantly reducing the risk of adversities or complications. Kushmin gave birth to a healthy child weighing 2.6 kg. Timely counselling paves the way for a risk-free pregnancy and a healthy infant, especially in rural areas where access to healthcare services is limited.”



## Towards a Skilled Future



Adani Saksham provides the youth with skill-based training, thereby increasing their employability and honing their entrepreneurial abilities. Aligned with the Government's Skill India Mission, it offers an array of vocational courses through a network of Adani Skill Development Centres (ASDCs). It is now incorporating advanced technology such as Augmented Reality-Virtual Reality (AR-VR) and launching courses in the Metaverse to make learning cutting-edge.

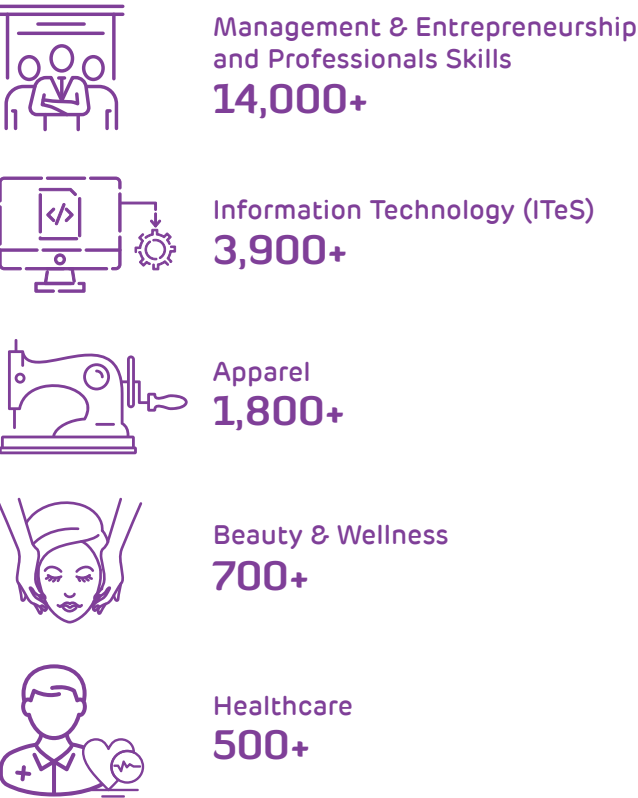

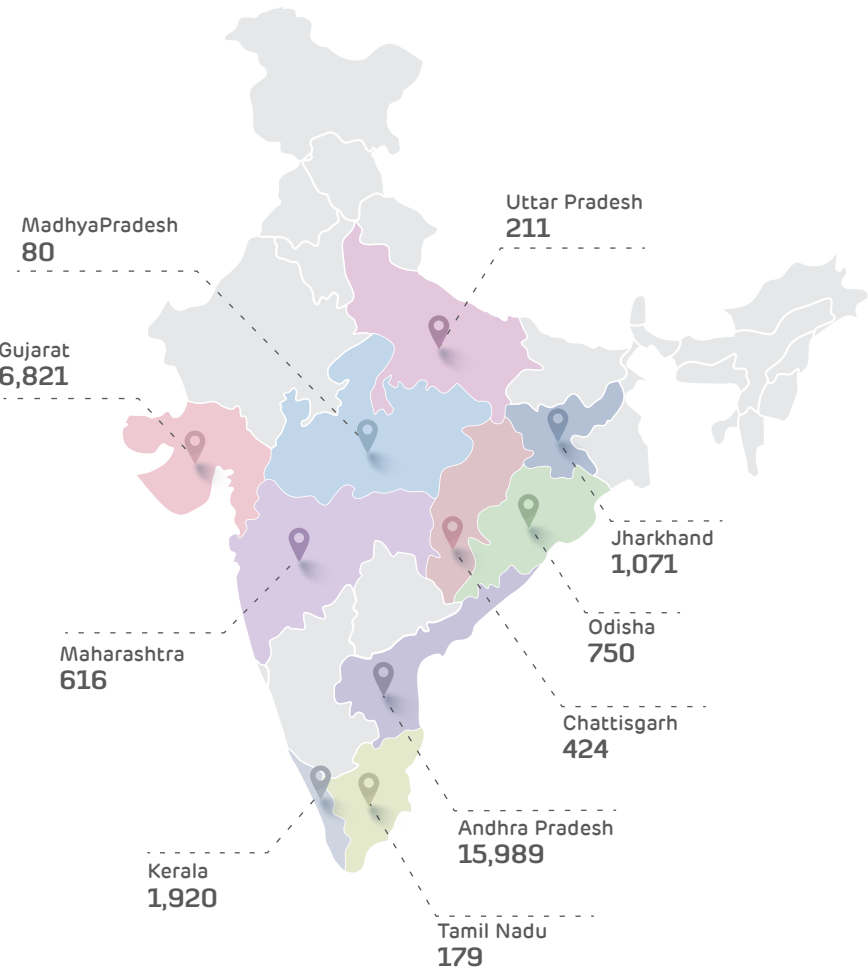

Currently, more than 400 women are trained to make incense sticks and dhoop sticks out of 100% natural ingredients like cow dung, camphor, guggal, coconut oil, sandal, etc. Their products are packed and marketed as 'Gangatiri', named after a local cow breed.
